ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- Double Extension of the Downtown TIF. The only one in Illinois resulting in the following projects:
 - > Jackson Street Corridor
 - > Illinois Realtors Bicentennial Plaza
 - > Y-Block underground water retention project
 - > Centre @ 501
 - > New Downtown-Enos Park YMCA
 - > Proposed DK Collection Hotel Project

GROWING & IMPROVING SPRINGFIELD

- LS Building Project – *Targeted TIF and sales tax incentive to develop mine subsided area*
- Motorheads – *Sales tax incentive to offset development cost for annexation*
- LRS Expansion Project – *Enterprise tax incentive*
- EmberClear Natural Gas Power Plant – *Enterprise zone designation*
- Salvation Army Clear Lake Community Center – *Adaptive reuse*
- Poplar Place Redevelopment – *Converting duplexes to single family housing*
- Benedictine Student Housing – *Redeveloped 9 units of supportive housing for veterans, especially female veterans*
- Structural Rubber Expansion – *Utilizing Community Development Block Grant Funds*
- TIF Residential Rehabilitation Program – *Utilized by 38 homeowners. \$400,000 available.*
- Far East TIF – *Extension and expansion*

RAILROAD RELOCATION TO TENTH STREET

- State of Illinois \$122 million rail funding
- Underpass Improvements for 5th & 6th Street near Stanford, South Grand and Cook Street
- New Underpasses for Laurel, Madison and Jefferson Streets

INFRASTRUCTURE

- Chatham Road improvements
- Iles Avenue & Archer Elevator Road
- Accomplished new Developers Agreement after 15 years, resulting in roads being built.
- Lead pipe replacement program

STABILIZATION OF CWLP

- Rate re-structure to stabilize electric rates
- Went from less than 5 days of cash to 111 days of cash according to Moody's most recent rating.
- Established an Environmental Rebate Fund that currently has more than \$20 million
- Built CWLP's first Solar Farm
- Completed an Integrated Resource Plan to determine future power needs

PUBLIC SAFETY

- Fire Department's Class 1 Rating. First time since 1988.
- Light Synchronization Technology installed in Springfield Fire Department engines
- Springfield Police Homeless Outreach Team program
- Springfield Police Focus Deterrence initiative
- Springfield Police Shotspotter platform
- Springfield Police partnership with Gateway for Safe Passage Addiction Recovery
